You could rephrase more:

university education =tertiary degree

free = without charge

financial background =economic situation, financial status, income level

Some people hold the view that every individual should have the right to receive tertiary education, so ~~that~~ it should be made free for every student regardless of their financial background. I partly agree with this opinion; while I understand that people should have access to university education without paying tuition fees, I think that this can become a financial burden on the governments.

On the one hand, I am convinced that the state should provide all citizens with free undergraduate education as they have the right to receive it. ~~It is believed~~ I believe [give your opinion in the first person] that the authorities are responsible for the quality of all citizens' lives [this sentence does not contribute anything] . At the same time [same time as what? What you right here in your topic sentence totally contradicts with the previous topic sentence that you wrote! This is a terrible mistake to make and leads to a severely lower score for task response.

On the other hand, I am afraid that a policy to provide free university courses is an inadvisable course of action. It should be acknowledged that the provision of free undergraduate education requires an enormous amount of ~~budget~~money. The establishment of a university, for example, demands a great deal of subsidies for constructing infrastructure and proper facilities as well as remunerations for highly intellectual lecturers. Therefore, making tertiary education free can create significant financial pressures that fall on the shoulders of the government, putting it at a risk of suffering from greater ~~economical~~ adversity [better to write "financial pressure".

In conclusion, I partly share the opinion that governments should provide all students with free university education. Although I understand that there are convincing arguments for offering free undergraduate education to all citizens, I think such policy can cause the state to incur more financial burdens.
